



Order: Ciconiiformes Family: Cariamidae

The Red-legged Seriema is a solitary, diurnal ground dwelling bird. Although it is able to fly it prefers to run to escape threats. It can obtain speeds up to 43 mph. It is one of a few birds which have eyelashes. Red-legged seriemas also have a unique crest which grows from the base of the bill.

One of the most distinctive features of the species is its vocalization. It has been described as a puppy yelping and can be heard from several kilometers. The call is usually heard in the morning and is used to define territory.
