Order: Artiodactyla Family: Bovidae

The Lesser Kudu is a medium sized antelope which lives in the bush of east Africa. It is sexually dimorphic. The males are blue-grey with white stripes and large spiraled horns while the females are reddish-brown with white stripes and hornless. There are two subspecies If lesser kudu with T. i. imberbis living in Ethiopia, Somalia and T. i. australis from Kenya, Sudan, Tanzania and southern Somalia.

The lesser kudu lives in the semi-arid bush utilizing the heavy thicket for cover. Having a slender body this antelope can maneuver through the thorny underbrush easily. The diet of leaves and fruit of water storing succulents provide the lesser kudu with enough water that it rarely drinks.
