

Order: Artiodactyla Family: Bovidae

The Nubian Ibex was previously considered a subspecies of the Alpine Ibex. Today it is a monotypic species restricted to Northern Africa and the Middle East. It is adapted for the arid, mountainous environment of the area.

The Nubian Ibex is a social animal living in herds. Males stay with natal herd for first three years of life. Then

form bachelor herds. During rutting season will participate in combat ramming each other with their large horns.
